

Our Headlines; 2015-16

In Maths at Key Stage 5 39% of our pupils made expected progress, or better

In Science at Key Stage 4- most students achieved a GCSE grade, despite a really late start to the course.

Students based at Horizon studying Preparation for Working Life made the best progress for any subject in any centre.

Art results showed students achieving beyond expectations, we also had a great art exhibition and feedback from the moderator was excellent.

Our long term virtual classroom students all did incredibly well and achieved beyond expectations. This means that the majority of students are now able to access A Level courses in their schools.

All Year 10 students who studied DT at Steps achieved Level 3 Entry Level Certificate, and are now ready to go on and study GCSE if they so wish.

All students in Key stage 3 made significant social and emotional progress- measured by the Boxall Profile

Most Key Stage 3 students moved on. The majority went successfully back to mainstream school; 2 moved on to specialist provision.

Most students in Key Stage 2 made social and emotional progress- measured using the Thrive assessment tool.
