What do the stats say?

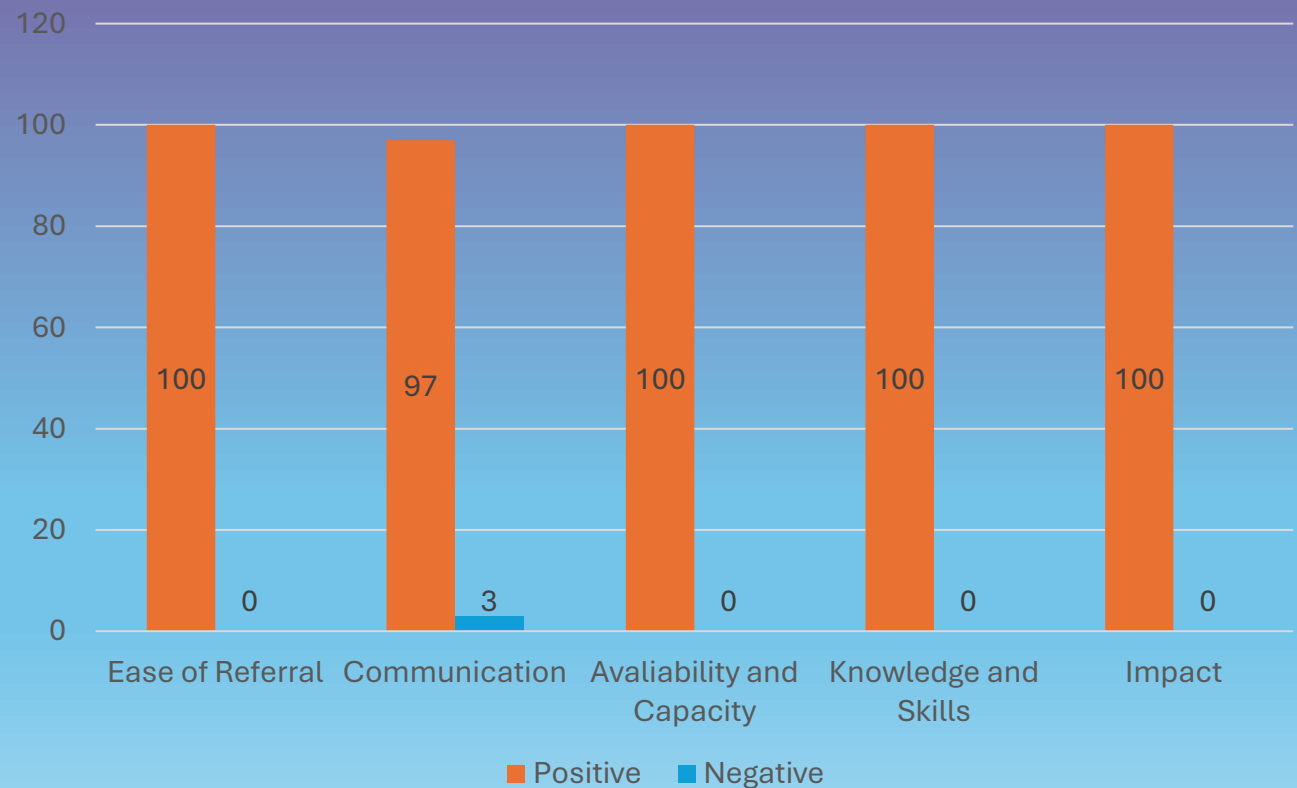

Pace of response

We aim to keep you up to date on any referrals. If you don't hear from us just get in touch – we are a small team and we've had over 200 referrals this year so we do our best to keep up.

Parental Support

This is not something we can offer, we don't have the capacity. Other agencies are able to offer this type of support and guidance. At ASW level the work does involve parental contact as well.

Bite size online drop ins – pre referrals

We don't have this, but you can always email or call to have a quick chat pre-referral, or we can come out to have a general chat through SEMH needs and come up with an action plan.

Training and mentoring for staff in schools.

We do have a training offer, and we can work alongside TAs in school. Contact us to find out more.

More communication

Most schools see this as a strength. To work truly as a partnership we need to all communicate well. Just get in touch if the key contact needs to change or someone else needs to be included.

Next Steps if ideas don't work

We hope this is already in place through termly reviews. Just get in contact and we can discuss this more or signpost to further support.
